LOCAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

THERE ARE NO UNPAID OR FREE PASSES FOR THE 2011 FAIR. A FOUR (4) DAY GATE ADMISSION CREDENTIAL WILL BE MADE AVAILABLE FOR ALL JUNIOR AND ADULT EXHIBITORS AT A SPECIAL REDUCED RATE. WRISTBANDS/PASSES MUST BE PURCHASED AT THE TIME OF ENTERING.

JUNIOR and ADULT EXHIBITORS.....\$16.00

LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS WRISTBAND.....\$16.00

PARENTS OF 4-H, FFA, AND JUNIOR EXHIBITOR (tickets or wristbands) .. \$16.00

EACH PARENT OR GUARDIAN IS ENTITLED TO ONLY ONE (1) PASS.

RV Parking for Fair: 1st Come First Served, one spot per family, may only register for your own spot, registration begins, first Monday of April 9:00 AM, Fair Office.....\$40.00 (No hook-ups)

ALL THE FOLLOWING RULES AND REGULATIONS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED. CASH AWARDS MAY BE WITHHELD IF COMPLIANCE WITH PRINTED STATE AND LOCAL RULES IS NOT FULLY MET.

DEFINITIONS

American Judging System: A judging process ranking exhibits against one another and award one first placing, one second placing, etc.

Danish Judging System: A judging process ranking each exhibit on its own merit against the scorecard or recognized standard and award as many first placing, etc. as merited.

Junior: Exhibitors ages 18 and under. The departments are divided into: Youth (13 and under) and Teen (14-18 years of age).

CASH AWARDS

THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MAY PRORATE CASH AWARDS PAID IF THE TOTAL AMOUNT TO BE PAID EXCEEDS BUDGETED AMOUNT.

NOTE: Cash award checks WILL NOT be mailed; checks not picked up with entries must be picked up at the fair office during regular fair office hours. Checks will be combined.

Judging Sheets will be used as evidence for payment of Cash Awards. Ribbons and tags are not acceptable as evidence.

1. Entries must be mailed to El Dorado County Fair, P.O. Box 1537, Placerville, CA 95667, or presented in person at the Fair Entry Office, El Dorado County Fairgrounds, 100 Placerville Drive, Placerville 95667. All entries must be postmarked or in the possession of the El Dorado County Fair no later than the dates and times indicated. Entries should be made as early as possible. Entry fees and other required papers must accompany entry forms at the time of entry, and will be accepted anytime following distribution of the Entry Guide. Checks should be payable to "EDCF" or "El Dorado County Fair Association". All livestock registration papers are checked upon registration of entries.
2. All classes are open to the world, except Junior Livestock.
3. The theme of this year's Fair is: "**ROCKIN' & WRANGLIN'!**"
4. The fair management shall reserve the right to limit entries in ALL classes to facilities available and may limit the number of entries made by an exhibitor. Any return of entries under this rule will be done generally and without discrimination.
5. Checks for awards in all classes will be made out in the name and address appearing on the entry form.
6. **ALL PREMIUM CHECKS ARE VALID FOR SIX MONTHS FROM DATE OF ISSUE.**
7. All discrepancies in payment of Cash Awards must be reported to Fair Management in writing, no later than 30 days after the close of the fair or they will not be considered. Ribbons will not be replaced by the fair after once being awarded.
8. All booths and exhibits will be constructed with the use of **non-flammable** material or material treated with flame retardant chemical.
9. No person or exhibitor will be permitted to distribute printed or advertising material or put up signs on the grounds without written permission of the fair manager.
10. Any display or exhibit not in keeping with the standards for division or class entered will not be allowed to remain on display after judging. Fair Management, who will be the sole judge of these standards, will make this decision. No refund of entry fees will be made for exhibits eliminated under this rule.
11. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to correctly fill out his own entry forms and thereby accepts responsibility for all errors thereon. Office personnel assist and answer questions but under no circumstances will complete entry forms for exhibitors. Judges may move items to classes that they feel exhibit fits better in. Entering classes correctly is sole responsibility of exhibitor. Exhibits entered incorrectly may be deemed ineligible before, during or after judging.
12. The Board of Directors will extend a grace period after the entry deadline to accept late entries in the office with a \$25.00 penalty.
13. Request for refunds must be formally written and presented to the fair board for their consideration. Refunds may be granted within the limits of the State Rules.
14. Overpayment of entry fees totaling \$3.00 or less will not be refunded.
15. No entries will be released without the official tag.
16. Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any direct or consequential loss, injury or damage done to or occasioned by and rising from animals or articles exhibited by him, and shall indemnify the association against any legal proceedings in regard

thereto. All property of every kind entered for competition or display or for any purpose being on the fairgrounds shall be subject to the control of this association. The association will exercise care and precaution for its safe preservation, but in no case will this association or its officers or agents be liable for damages or injury to a person or property of any exhibitor or patron of the fair, or be responsible for any accident, loss or damage of whatsoever nature that may occur on the fairgrounds or at any other place or time. Should property owners desire protection against loss or damage or injury from fire or other causes, they must make their own arrangements.

DISPUTES: THE MANAGEMENT RESERVES THE FINAL AND ABSOLUTE RIGHT TO INTERPRET THE RULES AND REGULATIONS, AND TO ARBITRARILY SETTLE QUESTIONS OR DIFFERENCES.

Protests/Disputes will only be considered if there has been a violation of State or Local Rules. Decisions of judges, veterinarians, weigh masters, tail dock officials and timers cannot be disputed and are final.

Protests (must be in writing) must be accompanied by a deposit of \$100 or \$200 if the protest relates to violations of State Rules X-XA (Animal Health Rules). The deposit will only be returned if the protest is upheld. Protest must be filed within 24 hours of the time of the cause of the protest. For more complete Protest Rules see "2011 State Rules for California Fairs" booklet.

Fair and Exhibit Fire Marshall Requirements

The following provisions **SHALL BE** applicable to all shows and exhibits:

- All decorative materials, including, drapes, signs, banners, overhanging table cloths/coverings, hay, straw, moss, plastic cloth, canvas, cloth, cardboard, leaves and similar combustible materials, **SHALL BE** made from non-flammable material or treated and maintained in a flame-retardant condition by means of a flame-retardant solution or process approved by the Fire Marshall.
- Materials that cannot be made flame-retardant are **PROHIBITED**.
- Literature on display shall be limited to "reasonable" quantities. Reserve supplies shall be kept in closed containers.
- Aisles and exits **SHALL BE** maintained clean, clear, and free of obstructions.
- Fire Extinguishers, hose cabinets, fire hose connections, exit signs and other fire appliances **SHALL BE** maintained clearly visible and unobstructed at all times.
- Booths, stands and other like construction shall be substantial and fixed in position in specified areas (according to approved plans) for the duration of the exhibit/show.
- Electrical extension cords **SHALL BE** approved three wire grounded type capable of carrying the intended ampacity of the combined appliances, and shall not be affixed to structures; extend through walls, ceilings, floors, under doors or floor coverings; or be subject to environmental or physical damage.
- **SMOKING IS PROHIBITED** in all buildings, public display areas, stages, restrooms, assembly areas and where posted "No Smoking".
- The show manager **SHALL BE** responsible for adequate rubbish removal.
- Exhibitors shall maintain their respective areas clean of combustible rubbish.
- All tents, awnings and fabric enclosures shall be labeled flame-resistant or flame-resistant treated as approved by the Fire Marshall.
- Heating and cooking equipment shall not be located within 10 feet of exits, aisles, passageways or combustible rubbish. Outdoor cooking that produces sparks or grease-laden vapors shall not be within 20' of tents or canopies.
- All compressed gas cylinders shall be secured in the upright position (chained).

Special notes:

1. *The Fire Chief (or his authorized representative) upon finding any overcrowded conditions; or obstruction in aisles, passageways or other means of egress (exiting); or upon finding any condition which constitutes a serious threat to life, SHALL cause the performance, presentation, or entertainment to be stopped until such conditions or obstruction is corrected.*
2. *Any automobile, truck motorcycle or other motorized vehicle displayed, SHALL have its batteries removed (or battery cables disconnected) and its fuel supplies reduced to not more than one quarter tank full. All motor vehicle tanks, which have ever contained fuel, SHALL BE furnished with a locking type cap or sealed with tape. Garden tractor's chain saws, power plants and other gasoline-powered equipment SHALL BE safeguarded in a similar manner.*

Exhibit Inspections

Periodic fire and life safety inspections **SHALL BE** conducted by the El Dorado County Fire Protection District and may include:

- Inspections with the "Show Manager" or authorized representative prior to move in/set-up period to insure fire hydrant and emergency vehicle access and egress.
- Familiarization and pre-incident planning.
- On-going site and vendor inspections to insure compliance of fire and life safety requirements of Titles 19 and 24 of the California Code of Regulations, National Fire Protection Association and California edition of the Uniform Fire Code.
- During closing and removal of exhibits to insure emergency access and egress.

Any problems or violations **SHALL BE** corrected immediately. Non-compliance **SHALL BE** grounds for possible citation and/or removal. The show or exhibit manager may be notified to assist in obtaining compliance. Fire and life safety **SHALL BE** the basis for any alternatives in conformity with applicable laws and ordinances. RULES

- A. Definition and judging procedure as prescribed in the latest version of the official Show Rules and the Standard of Perfection of the American Poultry Association, Inc. shall apply to all District and County Fair Poultry Shows, except in such instances where they are in conflict with the State Rules and regulations prescribed by the Department of Food and Agriculture.
- B. Birds will be shown and judged in the proper division and class for breed, variety, age and sex only. If no class is offered, no awards may be made.
- C. A judge may excuse a bird from competition if it appears to be fatigued or out of condition.
- D. For all classes of standard-bred chickens, all birds must be identified by leg bands conforming with the entry form on arrival at the show.
- E. Positively no hens with chicks.
- F. Limit of 5 entries per exhibitor per class and a total of 10 birds per exhibitor.
- G. All birds will remain at the Fair unless released by the Livestock Superintendent.
- H. All birds must be free from disease and external parasites; i.e.: lice, mites, ticks, etc. and their nits. Any birds found to have any apparent disease, sickness or parasites will be excused and removed from the fairgrounds and not allowed to return.
- I. Any LIGHT WEIGHT OR HEAVY WEIGHT breed or variety not mentioned will not be judged in the appropriate class as one division regardless of number of entries, breed variety, or color.
- J. Feeding and watering will be done by committee.
- K. Must be owned by Exhibitor 60 days prior to Fair.

NOTE: Cash award checks WILL NOT be mailed, checks not picked up with entries must be picked up at the fair office during regular fair office hours.

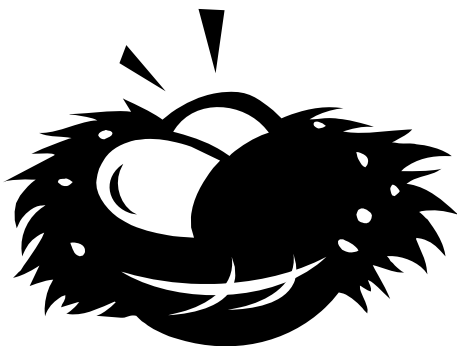

WILL BE HELD: SATURDAY, JUNE 18, 10 AM

- A. Only animals exhibited in their respective section in the current Fair’s Junior Livestock Department may be sold. Once entered for sale, animals cannot be withdrawn.
- B. All transactions will be based on show grade and weight upon arrival at the Fair except that lambs weighing in excess of 140 pounds, hogs weighing in excess of 275 pounds, and steers weighing in excess of 1300 pounds will have their sale weight adjusted to 140 pounds, 275 pounds, and 1300 pounds respectively. Only animals officially entered will be weighed. **NO BREEDING STOCK AND NO FEEDER ANIMALS WILL BE SOLD THROUGH THE AUCTION.**

- C. **An exhibitor is limited to selling one animal or meat pen** CHAMPIONS AND RESERVE CHAMPIONS MUST SELL. Exception: exhibitors with more than one eligible animal, including multiple champions, must designate which is to be sold by the end of the day of the show at the Livestock Office. If one exhibitor owns two champions he/she shall choose which one is to be sold. If one exhibitor has a champion and reserve champion, the champion is to be sold. Exhibitors failing to declare will have their highest placing animal lotted for sale by the Auction Committee.
- D. All participants in Junior Livestock Auction are encouraged to solicit new buyers.
- E. There will be a selling charge of 5% of the gross sale price to defray expenses of the livestock auction. This amount will be deducted from the seller’s check and will be deposited in a special fund provided for this purpose in the Junior Livestock Auction Committee’s accounts.
- F. Each animal will be sold to the highest bidder without reserve. The auctioneer’s word will settle all disputes regarding bids.
- G. The terms of the sale are cash. Bidding procedure will accept buying orders as allowable bids. Sales tags must be signed by the buyer or his agent. All animals sold at the auction for processing will have to be transported to a USDA approved facility. Transportation is provided by the Auction Committee, and the carcass returned to the processing plant of purchaser’s choice.
- H. All animals will be moved to the auction ring and returned to their stalls by the exhibitor.
- I. All animals will be fed and cared for by the consignor, free of charge to the purchaser, until the close of the fair on Sunday, June 19.
- J. Sale order will be determined by the management in charge and will be posted and announced. Fair Management reserves the right to arrange selling order in a manner that seems most equitable to all concerned.
- K. It shall be expressly understood that the El Dorado County Fair Association provides facilities, but assumes no liability.

VETERINARIAN

An official veterinarian will be on the grounds at least once each day. He is retained by the fair association to be on call. Any expense incurred for his professional services administering to an exhibitor’s animal is the responsibility of that exhibitor.

LOCAL DIVISION

All limited to El Dorado County residents or youth and teens enrolled in an El Dorado County School, K through 12, or non-El Dorado County residents that are bona fide members of a county 4-H Club/FFA or Grange

The Junior Department is for young people who want to enter exhibits at fairs. There are a number of organizations that encourage competition among members of the organization. The Fair offers this opportunity by establishing divisions and classes for groups such as FFA and 4-H Clubs and Grange. The Fair will also provide opportunity for young people to exhibit who are not members of an organization by either offering separate classes or allowing them to compete in direct competition with organization members.

FUTURE FARMERS OF AMERICA (FFA)

The Future Farmers of America (FFA) is a national organization of students enrolled in high school vocational agriculture classes. The local unit is the chapter in each high school offering vocational agriculture, under the supervision of the agriculture teacher who is always the local chapter advisor. Every Future Farmer project in Livestock, Poultry, Fruit or Crops is a part of the practical education of the vocational agriculture student who owns it. The program includes the improvement of agriculture, leading ultimately to the ownership of the farms and the development of good rural citizenship. Participation in fairs and livestock shows is recognized as having educational value as well as providing stimulation for better results and finer projects, under supervision of the qualified chapter advisor and with the cooperation of the fair management.

4-H ACTIVITIES

4-H youth programs are non-formal voluntary educational programs under the supervision of the Cooperative Extension Service of the University of California and the United States Department of Agriculture. They are a part of extension teaching. The projects exhibited at fairs by members of their groups are the result of their efforts under the supervision of volunteer adults.

Junior Livestock Exhibitor will not be allowed to stay on the Fairgrounds without adult chaperons.

Project Leader and Club Organizational Leader must have each signed the fair entry form to assure that 4-H youth are qualified in all respects to show at the fair.

4-H youth must be the owner of animals they exhibit. A Bill of Sale and Brand Inspection paper for cattle to verify ownership are required with entry form.

GRANGE

The Grange Youth Fair Program (GYFP) offers Junior Grange and Grange Youth Members the opportunity to exhibit at County Fairs and Expos across California. Junior Grange members are ages 5 – 14, and Fraternal Grange members ages 14 – 19 (Grange Youth). To provide guidance as they develop a greater understanding and appreciation for our agricultural abundance, as well as creating and developing individual skills.

All exhibitors of market animals must have their animals tagged with an El Dorado County Fair numbered ear tag. Ear tags must be obtained at the fair office

FFA Members: May participate in classes when they enroll in high school vocational agriculture classes and may exhibit as members through the end of the calendar year following graduation.

4-H Club Members: May enroll when they enter kindergarten and can exhibit as a member until the end of the calendar year in which the member becomes age 19.

PRIMARY MEMBERS: Must be 5 years old or in kindergarten as of January 1 of the program year. Primary members are not eligible to compete in divisions and classes at the El Dorado County Fair.

JUNIOR, INTERMEDIATE & SENIOR: Must be 9 years old or in fourth grade by January 1 of the 4-H program year.

Grange Members: Must be at least 14 years old and not older than 19 to be considered a Grange Youth. Junior Grange Members may be between 5 and 14 years old. Grange members must follow all requirements of other clubs and independents adhere to. If there are not enough Grange members to make up a specific class, then the Grange Youth will show in the FFA classes and the Junior Grange will show in the 4H Classes.

Independent Junior Exhibitors: Must be at least 9 years of age, and must not be older than 19 years of age on January 1. Fair may offer divisions and classes for those who are not under the FFA, 4-H or Grange Youth programs, not listed above recognized junior agricultural youth organization programs.

Independent Junior Exhibitors not affiliated with any organization may enter appropriate FFA or 4-H/Grange classes if they meet the age criteria (14 years and up, FFA; 13 years and under, 4-H) established for the agricultural youth organization exhibitors against whom they are competing if above similar classes are not offered in the Junior Department. Fair management can establish separate classes if there are sufficient entries. Independent Exhibitors must own all exhibits entered 60 days (120 days for beef and horses) prior to the opening day of the fair (See State Rule VII-18). If, during the preparation of an exhibit, an Independent Junior Exhibitor terminates membership in a recognized junior organization, the Exhibitor may not show the same type of exhibit within 60 days (120 days market beef) of the terminated membership. An Independent Junior Exhibitor can show only in classes of one recognized organization in a calendar year to the extent that such classes are available.

Independent Junior Exhibitors entering animals must provide Fair Management with a picture of their animal with an El Dorado County Fair numbered ear tag and tattoo information (if applicable) (excludes horse) appropriate proof of ownership 120 days prior to the fair for beef and horse, 60 days prior to the fair for all other animals.

Independent Junior Exhibitors must provide records book at check in.

Independent exhibitors must purchase insurance to cover their animal. Insurance may be purchased through the fair office from CFSA for \$35 per exhibitor. Independent Exhibitors must have "on ground" supervision by a responsible adult.

Affidavit for Independent Junior Exhibitor: The following described affidavit must be completed and filed with the fair by Independent Junior Exhibitors when submitting entry forms.

1. The livestock entry(s) entered above were under the Exhibitor's sole ownership, care and management for at least 60 days prior to the opening date of the fair (120 days for beef & horse). 2. That the undersigned has read and has full understanding of the rules and regulations governing the El Dorado County Fair and the California State Rules for the Network of California Fairs and agrees to be governed by them.

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK RULES

ALL livestock exhibitors **AT TIME** of registration **MUST** purchase exhibitor wristbands for County Fair. Exhibitor Bands must be worn for entrance throughout everyday of the fair. Additional wristbands purchased for parents must be picked up at time of purchase.

Livestock will be accepted beginning at **12:00 Noon, Tuesday, June 14, and must be in place by 8:00 PM, Wednesday, June 15.** For any deviation from receiving dates and/or times, prior approval must be received in writing from the Livestock Superintendent.

WEIGH-IN will be WEDNESDAY, JUNE 15 beginning at:

8:00 AM SWINE

11:00 AM BEEF

1:00 PM: SHEEP & GOATS

Junior market animals (Swine, Beef, Sheep & Goat) should be on the grounds and ready to weigh-in prior to designated times.

SCALES CLOSE AT 3 PM

SHEEP MAY BE MEASURED BY ULTRASOUND AT TIME OF WEIGH-IN FOR EDUCATIONAL PURPOSES.

LIVESTOCK WILL NOT BE PERMITTED TO LEAVE GROUNDS EARLIER THAN 8 PM ON SUNDAY, JUNE 19 ACCORDING TO SCHEDULE DETERMINED BY FAIR MANAGEMENT THROUGH THE LIVESTOCK SUPERINTENDENT. MARKET STEER, SHEEP & GOATS WILL LOAD AT 6 PM.

SHOW ORDER FOR 2011: FFA, Grange followed by 4-H, Market Classes followed by Breeding Classes

- A. All animals must be duly entered in the fair or will not be allowed on fairgrounds.
- B. Due to weight variances, entries in Market and Feeder Divisions should be made by division number only. All market animals will be weighed on arrival at the fairgrounds. No entry will be judged or premium paid unless it is weighed-in. **ONE WEIGH-IN ONLY.**
- C. No animal may be removed from the fairgrounds prior to regular release date and without expressed and written permission of the Livestock Superintendent or Fair Manager.
- D. Animals deemed unhealthy or dangerous by the show veterinarian or Fair Management will be dismissed from Fairgrounds.
- E. **IT IS THE INTENTION OF THE FAIR MANAGEMENT THAT THE MAJORITY OF THE LIVESTOCK FITTING IS DONE BEFORE THE ANIMAL ARRIVES AT THE FAIRGROUNDS AND THAT THE JUNIOR EXHIBITORS CARE FOR THE ANIMALS.** 4-H and Grange leaders and FFA advisors may demonstrate methods to the exhibitors only. Exhibitors must do the actual work. Adults and non-exhibiting youth are prohibited from performing work on Junior Exhibitors' animals while at the fairgrounds. Exceptions to this rule would be animals that are sick or need medical attention or obvious safety issues. Any person found guilty of breaking the above rule shall be subject to discipline as deemed appropriate by Fair Management. Infraction of this rule may be grounds for the Junior Exhibitor and animal involved to be disqualified and Cash Awards withheld.
- F. All stalls, pens and cages will be cleaned and freshly bedded no later than 9 AM each day. ALL manure and dirty bedding shall be placed in area designated by Management.
- G. All entry forms must be signed by leader, advisor, or authorized agent before submitting entry to Fair Entry Office and prior to closing of entries.
- H. **Market Steer, Swine, Sheep & Goats must have an ear tag attached and a photo of animal with ear tag and exhibitor attached to entry form when registering.**
- I. **All Cattle must have a TRANSPORTATION Slip when transporting cattle to and from Fair. (CA Food & Ag Code 21054)**
- J. No "For Sale" signs may be displayed. Any animal sold during the fair must have delivery and transfer of title made after the fair and off the fairgrounds.
- K. An exhibitor may sell only one animal (Beef, Sheep, Swine, Goats or Meat Pen of Rabbits or Poultry) and must declare, on the day it is shown, which is to be sold. Exhibitors failing to declare their sale animal will have the highest placing entry lotted for sale by the Auction Committee. Champions are required to sell. If an exhibitor owns two champions, exhibitor has the option to decide which to sell.
- L. Management reserves the right to assign all pens and cages, as it sees fit.
- M. Exhibitor will be responsible for all bedding.
- N. In order to comply with State Laws regarding lotteries, no raffles of any nature may be held on the fairgrounds during the fair, i.e., no tickets may be sold for money for a drawing where a prize is offered.
- O. As participation in the Junior Department of the fair is part of a total vocational education experience, FFA exhibitors will follow all school rules and above rules set down by FFA Advisors of El Dorado County, in addition to State and Local Rules as applicable.
- P. All 4-H exhibitors and Grange members must have a completed signed Code of Conduct on file with their Community Club Leader or Grange leader. Exhibitors must abide by the Code of Conduct.
- Q. All Future Farmers of America, Grange and 4-H exhibitors of livestock are requested to follow the official dress code of their organization while showing their animals.
- R. Independents must wear all white or white shirt w/ blue jeans.
- S. **MARKET ANIMALS that are SOLD at AUCTION WILL NOT RECEIVE CASH AWARDS.**
- T. **MARKET ANIMAL ENTRIES are LIMITED to TWO (2) ANIMALS per SPECIES per EXHIBITOR.** If an exhibitor brings more than 2 animals, those exceeding the limit must be immediately removed from the Fairgrounds.
- U. **Drench guns are not approved for use while on fairgrounds. Anyone found to be using any type of drench gun to administer liquids or paste into any animal without the supervision and direction of an official fair veterinarian and/or designated fair official, will result in exhibit and/or exhibitor being disqualified.**
- V. **ALL ANIMALS MUST BE REMOVED FROM FAIRGROUNDS NO LATER THAN NOON, MONDAY, JUNE 20.**
- W. All stalls will be furnished with the first bedding, provided by the Jr. Livestock Auction Committee; **exhibitors** will then maintain bedding in full, clean condition throughout the fair. Stalls must be cleaned completely at close of the fair or **\$20 will be charged to exhibitor. Failure to pay fine may jeopardize future shows at the County Fair. Any premium check due to exhibitor may be forfeited to cover the fine.**
- X. All exhibitors that show in Showmanship **MUST** enter and show in an appropriate market, breeding or performance class.

- Y. Any exhibitor paid in excess of premiums due, will reimburse the Fair or entity that over paid. **Failure to re-pay may jeopardize future shows at the County Fair.**
- Z. **Exhibitors MUST know all State & County Rules, State Rules may be obtained from www.cdfa.ca.gov/fe**
- 1. Animals must be tame enough to show and may be dismissed and/or Cash Awards and other awards withheld if in the judge's or fair management's opinion, any animal or animals constitute a danger to exhibitors or other animals.
- 2. All livestock exhibitors are to supply their own feed, water receptacles and cleaning tools, including wheelbarrows, for stalls, pens, and animals.
- 3. No Livestock entries will be accepted unless correctly made out as follows: NAME, REGISTRATION NUMBER, DATE OF BIRTH, BREEDER'S NAME, ADDRESS AND PHONE NUMBER OF BREEDER.
- 4. Nurse cows are not permitted on the fairgrounds
- 5. Livestock is received **Tuesday, June 14, 2011 at 12:00 Noon to 8:00 PM and Wednesday, June 15, 2011, 7:00 AM through 8:00 PM** unless otherwise stated in this book. Any deviation from receiving dates and/or times must receive prior approval in writing from Livestock Superintendent or Fair Management.
- 6. Livestock will be released **Sunday, June 19, 2011 at 8 PM** according to a schedule determined by Fair Management through the Livestock Superintendent.
- 7. Market Beef, Lambs and Goats will be released at **6 PM**.
- 8. AUCTION CHECKS WRITTEN TO THE SELLERS WILL BE MAILED OUT BY AUGUST 30, 2011. The Auction Committee asks that they receive no phone calls to inquire about payment until after this date.

EMERGENCY OR SITUATIONS OUT OF THE CONTROL OF EXHIBITORS:

- a. If an exhibitor has an emergency or a situation that is not in control of exhibitor and that it interferes with the exhibitor being able to show their animal or sell their animal in the auction. There will be a process to petition for another registered exhibitor to show/sell the animal in their place (with the exception of Showmanship classes). A representative each from 4H, FFA, Grange & Fair will meet to discuss the issues surrounding situation. The representatives should be: Fair Manager, 4H Program Director, FFA School Advisor/teacher & the Grange Leader. This group will look at each situation separately each year and vote. Prior decisions will have no bearing on current or future decisions.

NOTE: Cash award checks WILL NOT be mailed. Checks not picked up with entries must be picked up at the fair office during regular fair office hours.

Traffic on Fairgrounds:

After Wednesday, June 15, 2011 vehicles will be admitted on the fairgrounds through the Yellow Gate for a specific purpose with a special temporary Livestock Vehicle Pass.

GENERAL RULES

- All fees must be sent with entry form. All entries must be made on an official Fair Entry Form.
- Parent, member, project leader, and club organizational leader: EACH MUST sign the Fair Entry Form. All Junior Exhibitors must have project management records turned in to their Leader or Instructor.
- The following instructions from the State Rules are mandatory: **ALL YOUTH PARTICIPATING IN ANY JUNIOR EQUESTRIAN ACTIVITY, REGARDLESS OF RIDING SEAT, SHALL WEAR A PROPERLY FITTED EQUESTRIAN HELMET WHICH MEETS ASTM/SEI APPROVAL WITH SECURED CHIN HARNESS PROPERLY FASTENED AT ALL TIMES WHEN MOUNTED ON AN EQUINE OR IN A VEHICLE BEING PULLED BY ONE OR MORE EQUINES.**
- Exhibitors must wear the 4-H western dress code, consisting of long-sleeve white blouse or shirt with sleeves buttoned at wrist at all times, green 4-H tie or scarf, blue jeans, Western boots, belt, approved helmet, and numbers worn in designated place. FFA exhibitors must wear the FFA western dress code, consisting of long-sleeve white blouse or shirt with sleeves buttoned at all times, blue FFA scarf, black jeans, belt, Western boots, approved helmet, and numbers worn in designated place. Independent Riders must wear: Western dress code, consisting of long-sleeve white blouse or shirt with sleeves buttoned at wrist at all times, blue jeans, Western boots, belt, approved helmet, and numbers worn in designated place. English attire will consist of the same as the aforementioned except English boots, britches, and hard hat (with chin harness on at all times) will be required. Advertising of any form on the 4-H/FFA dress code is not permissible. The judge at his

discretion may refuse entry into the arena or remove an entry from a class for improper attire and/or equipment.

- Age of exhibitor is determined as of January 1, 2011. Junior Division exhibitors are those who have not reached their 14th birthday as of January 1, 2011. Senior Division exhibitors are those who have reached their 14th birthday as of January 1, 2011.
- NO STALLIONS ARE ALLOWED.
- The horse shown must be the member's project at least 120 consecutive days prior to the show date. 4-H/FFA youth must be legal owner of the horse or legal leasee, the horse must be kept on the property and be fully cared for by the 4-H/FFA member to qualify for entry. If the horse is leased, a copy of the lease, signed by the legal owner and 4-H/FFA member, and a clear picture of a side view of the horse or some permanent identification to be filed at least 120 days prior to the Fair with the 4-H Horse Resource Leaders or FFA Instructor.
- As a general rule, grooming, care and tacking of the horse/pony shall be performed by the 4-H/FFA exhibitor. Assistance may be given by any 4-H Horse Project Leader, FFA Instructor, or any other 4-H/FFA Horse Project Member. Where the safety of an exhibitor is concerned, assistance may be given by any 4-H or FFA adult.
- Pony and horse may be combined in all classes.
- WALK/TROT/JOG CLASSES** – Open to riders that have never shown in a lope class. **May not ride** in any other lope classes. Any rider may move up to a lope class in their division at the following show, **BUT** may not move back down to WALK/TROT/JOG once they have loped. Except due to a **SAFETY** issue, show management and horse project leaders may make a **combined decision** to allow the rider to move back down. There will be **WALK/TROT/JOG GYMKHANA** classes offered.
- GREEN CLASSES (1st AND 2nd YEAR)** – Open to horses that **have not been shown either English or Western prior to December 1, 2010.** Smooth Snaffles (ring or shank) or hackamore (braided rawhide) are required on horses 4 years and under; horses 5 years and over may be shown in a snaffle, hackamore or standard bit. Two hands must be used on snaffles and hackamore; one hand on western bits.
- First place winner of Novice Showmanship (Jr/Sr) will move up and show again in their correct age group, i.e. Jr or Sr Showmanship. Winner of Junior Showmanship will move up to Senior Showmanship and remain a senior showman all other fairs. Winner of Senior Showmanship will show in Round Robin at the Fair.
- WESTERN CLASSES** – Shall be shown in any standard western bit having a shank with a maximum length overall of 8½". The mouthpiece will consist of a metal bar 3/8" to ½" in diameter, varying from the straight bar to a high port. Jointed mouthpieces are permitted. Curb chains, if used, must be at least ½" in width, and lie flat against the horse's chin. Split rein or Romal rein may be used, but the reins must be attached to each shank. (One hand must be used when showing in a western bit. The only exception is green classes using snaffles/hackamores.)
- ENGLISH CLASSES** – Shall be shown in regulation snaffles, Pelham's or full bridles, all with nosebands. The judge, at his/her discretion, can penalize a horse with non-conventional types of bits or nosebands.
- PATTERN CLASSES** – English Equitation Senior and Western Horsemanship, both Junior and Senior.
- GYMKHANA CLASSES** – Open to both horses and ponies. Equipment and attire may be either English or Western but must be consistent. Western: Standard Western type stock seat saddle, standard type bit, hackamore or mechanical hackamore. English: Any English saddle approved for AHSA shows may be used. Bridle shall be either a snaffle with noseband, pelham or full bridle. Attire shall be English, including boots and a hard hat with chin guard in place. The

- judge may prohibit the use of bits or equipment deemed severe, inhumane, abnormal, or dangerous.
17. Eligibility for individual class levels will be determined by 4-H Project Leader, 4-H Resource Leader, Grange or FFA Instructor. ALL 4-H ENTRY FORMS MUST BE SIGNED BY HORSE PROJECT AND COMMUNITY CLUB LEADERS. ALL FFA/GRANGE ENTRY FORMS MUST BE SIGNED BY INSTRUCTOR.
 18. The Junior County Fair Horse Show will be judged in accordance with the rules and definitions set forth in the USA Equestrian Rule Book; the Gymkhana will be judged in accordance with the rules and definitions set forth in the California Gymkhana Association (CGA) bylaws and Rule Book, providing such rules and regulations do not conflict with the State Rules, County Rules, or 4-H/FFA/GRANGE Rules which prevail.
 19. Any exhibitor, leader or parent making a protest shall lodge such protest with the Fair Manager in writing within 24 hours of the time of the cause of the protest. Protests may only be based on violation of rules. No protest shall be considered by the Fair Board unless accompanied by a deposit of \$100. This deposit shall be forfeited if the protest is not sustained.
 20. The Junior Horse Show Staff and/or the Judge may disqualify from competition any Exhibitor who is abusive to an animal or demonstrates poor conduct and/or attitude. The Judge may disqualify any animal that is not sufficiently gentle to be shown with safety, or is not suitably sound. The Judge's decision shall be final.
 21. The Fair Management may cancel or combine classes based upon the number of entries. If there is a single walk/trot class it will be judged equitation.
 22. ALL 4-H RULES, FFA RULES, GRANGE RULES, COUNTY FAIR RULES, AND STATE FAIR RULES APPLY.

- Birds will be shown and judged in the proper division and class for breed, variety, age, and sex ONLY. If no class is offered, no awards may be made. Disqualified birds and those absent at the time of judging do not count when computing the number of exhibitors in the class.
- A judge may excuse a bird from competition if it appears to be fatigued or out of condition, but the bird shall be counted as an entry.
- For all classes of standard-bred chickens, all birds must be identified by leg band conforming with the entry form on arrival at the show.
- No hens with chicks will be allowed.
- Exhibitors are limited to a total of 10 birds, **except meat birds. They will be limited to 2 meat pens.**
- All birds must be free from disease and external parasites,** i.e., lice, mites, ticks, etc., and their nits. Any birds found to have any apparent disease, sickness or parasites will be excused and removed from the fairgrounds and not returned. There will be no refund for diseased birds.
- All birds will remain at the fair unless released by the Livestock Superintendent.
- Birds must be owned by exhibitor 60 consecutive days.

Open to all primary members 5 – 8 years old. Exhibits will not be judged nor will go to auction. Limit one animal per primary exhibitor. No ribbons, Cash Awards or plaques – educational.

Rules, definitions and judging procedure as prescribed in the latest edition of the Guide Book and Standard of the American Rabbit Breeder's Association, Inc., shall apply to all judging provided they do not conflict with any of the Department of Food and Agriculture.

- A. There is no limit on class and breed entries. Meat Pens are limited to two (2) pens per exhibitor. Single fryers are limited to one per exhibitor (not part of Meat Pen entry).
- B. No exhibitor may dictate to management the conditions under which they will exhibit. Pens are assigned by management, and are not reserved. All exhibitors must exhibit at least one (1) animal for duration of the fair. ALL BEST OF BREED AND BEST OPPOSITE BREED ANIMALS WILL REMAIN FOR DURATION OF FAIR.
- C. Substitutions may be made only within the same breed, variety, sex, and age (class) as the animal being withdrawn and must be made no later than one hour prior to judging.
- D. All animals must be identified by permanent ear markings conforming with that on the entry form on arrival at the show. Any duplication of ear markings by one exhibitor in the same division must be eliminated and the change recorded on the judging sheet before judging.
- E. Rabbits will be entered on the standard fair form. Rabbits must be entered by breed, variety, sex, ear numbers, age and in the correct division and class with the required owner's and leader's signatures to be considered a valid entry.
- F. Animals will be shown and judged only in the proper division and class for breed, variety, age, and sex.
- G. A judge may eliminate a rabbit from competition because of temporary or curable defect.
- H. PREGNANT does and does with litters will not be admitted into the showroom.
- I. All rabbits will be fed and cared for by the committee. No locks or hog rings will be permitted on the cages. No "FOR SALE" signs will be allowed on the cages. Failure to comply with any of the above rules will be cause for an exhibitor to remove his animals.
- J. All rabbits are entered at the owner's risk. Judges and show personnel are not responsible in any way. All reasonable precautions will be taken to ensure the rabbits' safety.
- K. Exhibitors will be expected to bring their own rabbits to the judging table. If exhibitor is busy in another barn, it is his/her responsibility to arrange for another 4-H or FFA member to get his/her rabbit to the table.
- L. Rabbits entered in Fur Division must also be in a Breed Division.
- M. Rabbits must be owned by exhibitor 30 consecutive days.
- N. **ANY VIOLATION OF STATE OR LOCAL RULES WILL RESULT IN LOSS OF ANY CASH AWARDS AND/OR AWARDS.**

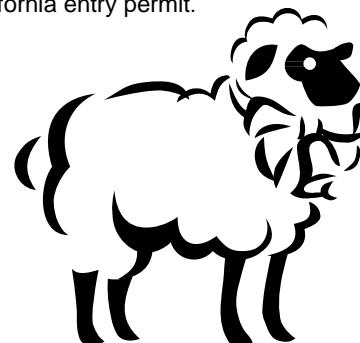

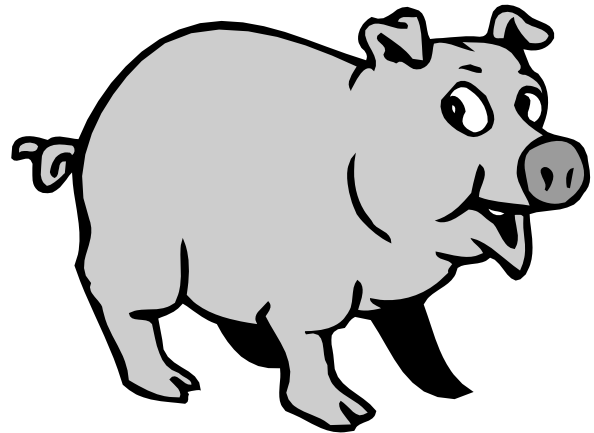

- LARGE ANIMAL:** First place winners in the GRANGE Showmanship Division Beef, Dairy Cattle, Sheep, Swine, Dairy & Market Goats, and Horse are eligible to enter. Second place winners will be eligible as alternates if the first place winner is unable to compete.
- SMALL ANIMAL:** First place winners in the GRANGE Showmanship Division Poultry, Rabbits, Cavies, and Pygmy & Dwarf Goats are eligible to enter. Second place winners will be eligible as alternates if the first place winner is unable to compete.

**California State Fair Best of Show
Master Showmanship**

The California State Fair Best of Show Competition is open to exhibitors winning the Master Showmanship in large and small animal competitions at their County, District or Citrus Fair. Only the one (1) Large Animal Master Showmanship winner and the one (1) Small Animal Master Showmanship winner are eligible to enter. The winner may be from either FFA, 4-H or Grange, but only 1 exhibitor goes on. To obtain a premium book, entry form and further information go online to www.bigfun.org.

Exhibitors that belong to FFA, GRANGE and 4H with different species may compete in their species Showmanship Class. If he/she wins more than one class, he/she may enter the Master Showmanship class in GRANGE, FFA and 4H as long as the GRANGE, 4H and FFA classes are judged separately and as long as the exhibitor exhibits in appropriate uniform for all classes
