HOW to ENTER the EL DORADO COUNTY FAIR...in 3 EASY STEPS

- 1. Use this entry guide to complete the entry form.** (There is an entry form on the next page.) The entry guide is divided into 2 sections: Adult and Junior (Teen and Youth, 4-H, FFA, Youth Clubs) Departments listed in each section (for example, Baking and Confections) are divided into Divisions (for example, Breads and Cakes) which are further divided into Classes (for example, Carrot Cake and Pound Cake). Rules for each department are listed at the beginning of each department. Exhibitors are responsible for reviewing the rules pertaining to their entries.

A. Entry forms must be completely filled out with personal information; name, address, etc. and signed.

B. The appropriate division and class for each item must be included on entry form. A thorough description of each item is important. (The fair will transfer items to more appropriate classes if necessary, but the exhibitor is responsible for entries disqualified due to errors)

LOCAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

THERE ARE NO UNPAID OR FREE PASSES FOR THE 2012 FAIR. A FOUR (4) DAY GATE ADMISSION CREDENTIAL WILL BE MADE AVAILABLE FOR ALL JUNIOR AND ADULT EXHIBITORS AT A SPECIAL REDUCED RATE. WRISTBANDS/PASSES MUST BE PURCHASED AT THE TIME OF ENTERING.

JUNIOR and ADULT EXHIBITORS.....\$16.00
LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS WRISTBAND..... \$16.00
PARENTS OF 4-H, FFA, AND JUNIOR EXHIBITOR (tickets or wristbands)...\$16.00
EACH PARENT OR GUARDIAN IS ENTITLED TO ONLY ONE (1) PASS.

ALL THE FOLLOWING RULES AND REGULATIONS WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED. CASH AWARDS MAY BE WITHHELD IF COMPLIANCE WITH PRINTED STATE AND LOCAL RULES IS NOT FULLY MET.

DEFINITIONS

American Judging System: A judging process ranking exhibits against one another and award one first placing, one second placing, etc.

Danish Judging System: A judging process ranking each exhibit on its own merit against the scorecard or recognized standard and award as many first placing, etc. as merited.

Junior: Exhibitors ages 18 and under. The departments are divided into: Youth (13 and under) and Teen (14-18 years of age).

CASH AWARDS

THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS MAY PRORATE CASH AWARDS PAID IF THE TOTAL AMOUNT TO BE PAID EXCEEDS BUDGETED AMOUNT.

NOTE: Cash award checks WILL NOT be mailed; checks not picked up with entries must be picked up at the fair office during regular fair office hours. Checks will be combined.

Judging Sheets will be used as evidence for payment of Cash Awards. Ribbons and tags are not acceptable as evidence.

1. Entries must be mailed to El Dorado County Fair, 100 Placerville Drive, Placerville, CA 95667, or presented in person at the Fair Entry Office, El Dorado County Fairgrounds, 100 Placerville Drive, Placerville 95667. All entries must be postmarked or in the possession of the El Dorado County Fair no later than the dates and times indicated. Entries should be made as early as possible. Entry fees and other required papers must accompany entry forms at the time of entry, and will be accepted anytime following distribution of the Entry Guide. Checks should be payable to "EDCF" or "El Dorado County Fair Association". All livestock registration papers are checked upon registration of entries.
2. All classes are open to the world, except Junior Livestock, unless otherwise stated.
3. The theme of this year's Fair is: "**The Grapest Show on Earth!**"
4. The fair management shall reserve the right to limit entries in ALL classes to facilities available and may limit the number of entries made by an exhibitor. Any return of entries under this rule will be done generally and without discrimination.
5. Checks for awards in all classes will be made out in the name and address appearing on the entry form.
6. **ALL PREMIUM CHECKS ARE VALID FOR SIX MONTHS FROM DATE OF ISSUE.**
7. All discrepancies in payment of Cash Awards must be reported to Fair Management in writing, no later than 30 days after the close of the fair or they will not be considered. Ribbons will not be replaced by the fair after once being awarded.
8. All booths and exhibits will be constructed with the use of **non-flammable** material or material treated with flame retardant chemical.
9. No person or exhibitor will be permitted to distribute printed or advertising material or put up signs on the grounds without written permission of the fair manager.
10. No cash awards may be paid for articles not named in the premium list; such articles may be accepted by the management and placed on exhibition and if considered by the judges to be worthy, they may be awarded a special ribbon.
11. Any display or exhibit not in keeping with the standards for division or class entered will not be allowed to remain on display after judging. Fair Management, who will be the sole judge of these standards, will make this decision. No refund of entry fees will be made for exhibits eliminated under this rule.
12. No organization will be eligible for competition in sweepstakes.
13. No entry will be accepted in the following departments if said article or exhibit has been exhibited and placed at any previous El Dorado County Fair: Home Arts, Arts & Crafts, and Youth Department exhibits other than Livestock or Horse Show. If said article is accepted by mistake, no Cash Awards will be paid, and the exhibitor will forfeit the entry fee.
14. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to correctly fill out his own entry forms and thereby accepts responsibility for all errors thereon. Office personnel assist and answer questions but under no circumstances will complete entry forms for exhibitors. Judges may move items to classes that they feel exhibit fits better in. Although, it is not the responsibility of the staff or of the judges to move items that have been entered incorrectly. Entering classes correctly is sole responsibility of exhibitor. Exhibits entered incorrectly may be deemed ineligible before, during or after judging.
15. The Board of Directors will extend a grace period after the entry deadline to accept late entries in the office for all departments except Open Horse, Farming Science/Horticulture, and Floriculture, with a \$25.00 penalty.

16. Request for refunds must be formally written and presented to the fair board for their consideration. Refunds may be granted within the limits of the State Rules.
17. Overpayment of entry fees totaling \$3.00 or less will not be refunded.
18. No entries will be released without the official claim check or proper Identification proving ownership.
19. Best of Show, is an award given to the "best" exhibit in all of the classes listed in the division.
20. Sweepstakes, is an award given to an Exhibitor that received the most points totaling from Divisions stated in premium book. Points are awarded as follows:
 - 1st Place – 5 points
 - 2nd Place – 3 points
 - 3rd Place – 1 pointSweepstakes are awarded only when there are at least three separate Exhibitors who have achieved at least a combined total of 25 points. To receive Sweepstakes Awards, an Exhibitor must have a minimum of 10 points. Sweepstakes points will only be awarded to the Exhibitor whose name is on the entry form.
21. Each exhibitor shall be solely responsible for any direct or consequential loss, injury or damage done to or occasioned by and rising from animals or articles exhibited by him, and shall indemnify the association against any legal proceedings in regard thereto. All property of every kind entered for competition or display or for any purpose being on the fairgrounds shall be subject to the control of this association. The association will exercise care and precaution for its safe preservation, but in no case will this association or its officers or agents be liable for damages or injury to a person or property of any exhibitor or patron of the fair, or be responsible for any accident, loss or damage of whatsoever nature that may occur on the fairgrounds or at any other place or time. Should property owners desire protection against loss or damage or injury from fire or other causes, they must make their own arrangements.
22. Any exhibit left after release date and times will be forfeited.
23. Please see "Junior Livestock Rules" for rules concerning livestock exhibits.

DISPUTES: THE MANAGEMENT RESERVES THE FINAL AND ABSOLUTE RIGHT TO INTERPRET THE RULES AND REGULATIONS, AND TO ARBITRARILY SETTLE QUESTIONS OR DIFFERENCES.

Protests/Disputes will only be considered if there has been a violation of State or Local Rules. Decisions of judges, veterinarians, weigh masters, tail dock officials and timers cannot be disputed and are final.

Protests (must be in writing) must be accompanied by a deposit of \$100 or \$200 if the protest relates to violations of State Rules X-XA (Animal Health Rules). The deposit will only be returned if the protest is upheld. Protest must be filed within 24 hours of the time of the cause of the protest. For more complete Protest Rules see "2012 State Rules for California Fairs" booklet.

ADULT FINE ARTS **Divisions 40 - 42**

PROFESSIONAL EXHIBITORS are for those professional artists who TEACH, SELL regularly, or have gallery shows.

NON-PROFESSIONALS are for those who engage in arts and crafts work as a HOBBY or for the love of the work, whose return from sales, if any, does not exceed the cost of the material for the articles sold and who are not otherwise remunerated on account of engaging in this work, except for cash prizes and Cash Awards.

ADULT RULES

- A. Entries must be the original work of the exhibitor within **two years** of the opening date of the fair to be eligible for premium awards.
- B. Entries shown in previous El Dorado County fairs will not be accepted.
- C. Professional exhibitors are not permitted to enter Division 40.
- D. Non-Professional exhibitors are not permitted to enter Division 42.
- E. There is a limit of **two** entries per exhibitor per class.
- F. All exhibits **MUST BE IN A SUITABLE FRAME/GALLERY WRAP** and ready for hanging with **screw eyes and wire**, or they will not be hung.
- G. Size of entries is limited to no larger than 36"x48".
- H. All entries must have a title on the entry form.
- I. Copyright mark with date of creation is recommended in all works.
- J. Exhibitor's name shall be printed on the back of the entry. Exhibitor's name should not be exposed on the front of picture. If a name is on the front, please cover with tape.
- K. Nude studies will not be accepted.
- L. Exhibits may be sold. A 25% commission will be charged. Entries must be labeled "FOR SALE" and the price indicated on the entry form. Sales must occur during Fair & purchaser must pick up item on release date, Monday following close of Fair.
- M. Insurance desired on any entry must be carried by the exhibitor. The fair will assume no responsibility for any article that is lost, stolen, or damaged.
- N. No entries will be released without a claim check.
- O. No entries may be removed during the Fair.
- P. Unless valid reasons can be proven, no late entries will be accepted.
- Q. **STATE RULES APPLY**
- R. **Entries will not be accepted if the above rules are not followed.**

NOTE: Cash award checks WILL NOT be mailed, checks not picked up with entries must be picked up at the fair office during regular fair office hours.

 - M. No dressing, wiring, artificial flower or fillers permitted. Wedging permitted, provided by the exhibitor.
 - N. Hybrid Tea Roses, Hybrid Perpetuals and large Exhibition Dahlias to be shown debudded. Stems should be approximately 9 to 12 inches or in proportion to the flower.
 - O. In Fresh Arrangements, plant material need not have been grown by the exhibitor. Foliage or accessories permitted in all classes of the Arrangements Division unless otherwise noted. No artificial flowers or dried flowers allowed.
 - P. No Dry Arrangement entry will be accepted if exhibit has been exhibited and placed at any previous El Dorado County Fair.
 - Q. Every exhibit will be subject to departmental rules but the association will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage which may occur and entries are made and accepted on this condition.
 - R. All plant materials used in garden exhibits must be growing, unless otherwise specified.
 - S. Plant material and flowers should be well hardened and groomed.
 - T. Plant material on State Conservation List may not be exhibited.
 - U. **FRESH FLOWERS OR PLANT MATERIAL** must be used in all arrangements except those specifically indicated otherwise. **NO ARTIFICIALLY COLORED** fresh plant material or **ARTIFICIAL FLOWERS** are permitted.
 - V. **FRESH FOLIAGE** permitted in all arrangements unless otherwise noted. Succulents may be classed by foliage. **NO ARTIFICIAL** foliage may be used.
 - W. **DRIED MATERIALS** may be sparingly colored and treated.

GLOSSARY**

CUT FLOWERS

- a. **ANNUAL:** A plant that completes its outdoor cycle of growth in one year.
- b. **BIENNIAL:** A plant that normally completes its outdoor cycle of growth in two years.
- c. **PERENNIAL:** A plant that lives, blooms, and seeds for more than two years. Trees and shrubs are hardwood perennials.
- d. **HERBACEOUS PERENNIALS:** A plant that lives longer than two years, but in colder climates dies back to the ground each winter.
- e. **SPIKE:** A flower structure with flowers, stemless or very short stemmed, on a common length stalk, i.e., Gladiolus.
- f. **SPRAY:** Portion of a plant with a number of flowers on one stem, with at least two flowers open, i.e. Cosmos and Salpiglosses.
- g. **STEM:** The main ascending part of a plant.
- h. **STALK:** A stiff stem which may or may not branch one or more flowers and buds.
- i. **BLOOM:** Individual flowers, one blossom on a stem, i.e., H.T. Roses, Carnations, all disbudded.
- j. **SPECIMEN:** A single plant, fruit, vegetable, bloom or spike, spray, stalk or stem.

- A. The purpose of the exhibit is to create interest in gems and minerals for collecting and identification lapidary arts and earth sciences.
- B. Any individual or organization may enter displays. There is no age limit.
- C. In the Mineral Specimens Division, specimens entered may be from any source, but the judge shall show preference for California minerals. In all Divisions, the judge shall show preference for displays that are most effectively educational, as shown by the information provided by the Exhibitor and the method of presentation. The attractiveness of the display and the variety of material shall also be considered.
- D. Each exhibitor is to include a **Theme Label** in the display giving a description of the Class. **Examples:** Variety of Worldwide Minerals, Self-Collected Minerals, Mounted Gemstones, Lapidary Arts – Slabs (work done by exhibitor), etc. If there is only one specimen the theme label may be incorporated into the descriptive label.
- E. In the Lapidary Arts Division, preference shall be given to work that has been done by Exhibitor. Required labeling is to indicate whether or not work was done by Exhibitor
- F. Exhibitor is to correctly and adequately label specimens:
 - a. Mineral specimens must be labeled as to identification of Name and Variety, and Location in which they were found.
 - b. Fossil specimens must be labeled as to identification of Common Name, Phylum, Class or Subclass, Time Period, and Location in which they were found.
 - c. Petrified wood, wood casting and plant life specimens must be labeled as to identification of Species, Time Period, and Location in which they were found.
- G. All previous first place competitive entries must have at least 20% new material. However, past first place winners may enter same exhibit in a non-competitive class.
- H. **Cases:** Fairgrounds shall provide cases including lights. Exhibitor shall provide case liners and risers. (Liners and risers are recommended to enhance the exhibit). Each entry is limited to one case or one-half case, depending upon material. Display supervisor may assign smaller displays (such as single-specimen mineral, jewelry, lapidary) a portion of a case. Exhibitor shall be contacted regarding case usage.
 - a. Interior dimensions of display cases supplied by Fairgrounds are: 45" wide x 22" deep x 22" high. Interior dimensions of a half case are: 22 ½ wide x 22" deep x 22" high.

- b. Exhibitor may provide his or her own case(s). This should be noted on application along with exterior dimension of case(s). The maximum exterior dimensions of a case shall not exceed 48" wide x 24" deep x 24" high.
- I. Exhibitors are not limited as to the numbers of entries; however, they can only receive one cash award per person per class or two cash awards per family per class.
- J. The judging criteria for each entry shall be available in the Fair Office upon request.
- K. The judge shall not award a premium or ribbon where there is insufficient merit.
- L. Judging shall be according to American Federation of Mineralogical Society (CFMS) Uniform Rules as appropriate. These rules are available on the AFMS website (www.amfed.org) or from the El Dorado County Mineral and Gem Society. To the extent AFMS rules do not apply, scoring shall be in accordance with El Dorado County Mineral and Gem Society procedures. Decision of the judge in all matters is final.

Thus, if a fleece is actually slightly more than 12 months growth, due to unavoidable delay in obtaining shearers, or by weather, it shall be termed "12 months" wool.
- C. Wether fleeces may be included in Wether classes ONLY (Div 333).
- D. **Each exhibitor will be limited to two fleece entries in each class.**
- E. All fleeces entered must have been sheared from sheep owned by the exhibitor.
- F. The judge has the authority to reclassify fleeces before making awards.
- G. Wool fleeces should be rolled, cut (flesh) side out and placed in large, clear, plastic bags. with clearly marked cards with exhibitor's name & address on one side and breed of animal on the other side. Non-wool fleeces shall be presented in the manner considered most standard for the industry, also with cards as stated above. Paper twine is discouraged.
- H. Market or cross bred fleece should be placed in a class which most appropriately describes its individual wool grade.
