FUN MATCH – RULES

- A. This match is open to any boy or girl who is currently enrolled in a 4-H dog care and training project. A maximum of 2 dogs may be entered per member. Both dogs to be owned by the 4-H member or his immediate family, and trained by the 4-H member.
- B. Dogs must be owned by members for 150 days (5 months) prior to the opening of the fair.
- C. Exhibitors are requested to wear the 4-H uniform. Each dog must be shown with a six-foot leather or fabric leash and a choke chain. Appropriate leash should be used for showmanship.

RIBBONS TO THREE PLACES NO ENTRY FEE

Class consists of 3 breeding or market animals exhibited in preceding division. Animals must be owned by at least three different exhibitors from one club or chapter.
One entry per club or chapter.

The ultrasound carcass test should be entered when registering for the fair. MUST have pre-weight on entry form.

DIVISION 414

CLASS 1

Ultrasound test will be performed on carcass right after steer is weighed in.

- D. Bitches in season will not be allowed to compete.
- E. Judging will be in accordance with American Kennel Club regulations unless they are in conflict with the California Department of Food and Agriculture State Rules.
- F. Uncontrolled or aggressive dogs will be asked to leave.
- G. Breed of dog and member's birth date must appear on entry form.
- H. EXHIBITORS MUST ENTER BOTH OBEDIENCE & SHOWMANSHIP.
- I. Winner of Best in Showmanship will be eligible for Round Robin Showmanship (small animal).

AMERICAN SYSTEM OF JUDGING OBEDIENCE, RALLY & SHOWMANSHIP

Open to all primary members 5 – 8 years old. Exhibits will not be judged. Limit one animal per primary exhibitor. No ribbons, Cash Awards or plaques – educational.

NO CASH AWARDS – RIBBONS AND PLAQUES ONLY
 ENTRY FEE: \$3 PER ENTRY PER CLASS
 (Primary members included)

DIVISION 418 – RALLY

CLASS

1. Novice A: First year exhibitor
2. Novice B: Second year exhibitor or above.

DIVISION 419 – HANDLING (SHOWMANSHIP)

All members having received 3 Blue Ribbons in regular Showmanship classes must show in the open class for their age group, regardless of year in 4-H.

CLASS

1. Novice Junior: Open to members 12 years and under as of show date, who are in their first or second year of Dog Care and Training Project.
2. Novice Intermediate: Open to members 13 – 15 years old as of show date, who are in their first or second year of Dog Care & Training Project.
3. Novice Senior: Open to members 16 years and older as of show date, who are in their first or second year of Dog Care and Training Project.
4. Open Junior: Open to members 12 years and under who are in their third year of the project or have received 3 Blue Ribbons in any show.
5. Open Intermediate: Open to members 13 – 15 years old as of show date, who are in their first or second year of Dog Care & Training Project.
6. Open Senior: Open to members 16 years and older who are in their third year or above in the project or have received 3 Blue Ribbons in an AKC show. The four first place winners will compete for Best in Showmanship. A 4-H member may show two dogs in the obedience class, but only one in showmanship because the judging is on the handler.

DIVISION 415 – SUB-NOVICE OBEDIENCE

All exercises on six-foot leash, heeling, figure eight, recall, stand for examination, long sit (1 minute), long down (3 minutes).

CLASS

1. Sub-Novice A: First year exhibitor and first year dog
2. Sub-Novice B: Second year or above exhibitor

DIVISION 416 – NOVICE OBEDIENCE

All exercises off leash. Heel, figure eight, stand for examination, recall, long sit (1 minute), long down (3 minutes). All exhibitors participating in this division must have experience showing in an AKC match.

CLASS

1. Novice A: Exhibitor has never received a leg toward a Companion Dog title on ANY dog
2. Novice B: Any dog that has not received a Companion Dog Title, but has a leg toward a Companion Dog Title

DIVISION 417 – OPEN OBEDIENCE

Heel free and figure eight, drop on recall, retrieve on flat, long sit (1 minute – out of sight), and long down (3 minutes – out of sight).

CLASS

1. Open A: Dogs must have Companion Dog title, but no leg towards C.D.X. title
2. Open B: Dogs must have Companion Dog title. Dogs with C.D.S. or one or more legs toward C.D.X. must compete here

ALL GOATS must have their premise identification (tattoos or ear tag) and registration (for Dairy Goats and Nigerian Dwarf Dairy Goats only) on the grounds at all times due to the Scrapies Eradication Program*. To enroll, call 877-741-3690.

No refunds will be made for diseased animals.

RULES

- A. All stalls must be stripped clean at end of Fair, see Livestock Rule #W, page 12.
- B. Only animals with a "Certificate of Registry" (blue border) issued for purebred animals are eligible.
- C. Animals with a "Certificate of Pedigree" (brown border) issued for grade animals are not eligible.

- C. Stamped duplicate or application for registry is not acceptable (original copy only).
- D. A permanent ear tattoo is required.
- E. Junior Yearling in milk must be shown with Senior Yearling in milk.
- F. All animals in "registered purebred breeding animal" divisions must be registered and recorded with a United States breed association in the exact name of the exhibitor (owner) as declared on the entry form.
- G. All breeding goats must be individually owned by the exhibitor for at least 30 consecutive days prior to the opening day of the fair. The management may demand such proof or ownership as it deems necessary in each case.
- H. RECORDED GRADE DAIRY GOATS: A permanent ear tag or tattoo is required. Animals with a "Certificate of Pedigree" (brown border) issued by the American Dairy Goat Association are eligible EXCEPT ANIMALS IDENTIFIED AS NATIVE ON PERFORMANCE AND NATIVE ON APPEARANCE. Animals with a "Certificate of Registry" (blue border) issued by ADGA are not eligible.
- I. All sheep and goats from out of state require official individual identification valid for 30 days after inspection of the animals, a certificate of veterinary inspection and a California entry permit within 15 days of entering California.
- J. Rams older than 6 months require a negative Brucella Ovis test within 60 days of entry into California, unless entering for exhibition without change of ownership.
